

The book kicks off with a detailed description of legendary Austrian skier Franz Klammer's wild gold medal run down the most famous downhill, the Hahnenkam in Kitzbuhel, Austria, at the 1976 Innsbruck Winter Olympics (just go YouTube it and be amazed). This intro on paper alone gives you such chills and makes you feel as if you are there barreling down the mountain alongside Klammer. Yes, author Nathaniel Vinton is THAT good a writer. Simply put, this is one bodacious thrill ride of a read through the world of ski racing. Although the emphasis is on the two main American stars in the sports these days, Bode Miller and Lindsey Vonn, Vinton covers much of the World Cup tours from the years leading up to the 2010 Vancouver Winter Olympics to a bit beyond to Sochi 2014. Don't be fooled by these two big events because Vinton has his pulse on really what makes ski racing tick--that traveling ski race roadshow known as the World Cup. I found all the stuff that revolves around ski racing even more fascinating than the actual races (and they're pretty good on their own). The training and rehab these top-class athletes go through is mindblowing and will give you a greater appreciation for the sport. I'm just a casual ski racing fan who got into it in the '70s and '80s thanks to the Crazy Canucks and only now just got back into it again so you don't have to be a diehard ski race fan at all to get into this. The casual sports fan period will appreciate all the inside scoops we learn like how Americans (and Norwegians, Swedes, Canadians) compete with that inner Alps circle (Austria, Switzerland, Italy and Germany) that tended to dominant ski racing from its start.
